**Credit card**: We accept credit card payments by Visa or MasterCard but there is a 2% credit card handling fee. To avoid incurring this bank cost you can pay by;

**Cash or internet banking;** Internet banking, please place the **tour number with the first 4 letters of your surname in the reference field e.g. 101425WITH.** If you are paying for more than one tour, please place the other tour number in the code field. If you are paying your patron fee in the same payment, please write PATRON in the particulars field.

This also applies if you visit a Kiwibank branch to make an over-the-counter deposit. <u>You</u> <u>MUST highlight your reference details on your deposit slip to the teller to ensure they key</u> them in for your transaction.

#### **Conditions & Important Booking Information**

#### 1. Reservations & Payments

All day trips should be made in one payment at the time of booking.

For all overnight or longer tours, a deposit as stated in the Leisure Guide is payable to secure the booking. The balance must be paid in full by the declared date in the Leisure Guide.

Any customer who has booked a package with Bay Tours shall not assign, purport to assign, or attempt to re-sell the package (whether whole or in part), rights or interests under these Terms without prior consent from Bay Tours.

Any reservation made within six (6) weeks of the tour departure must be paid in full.

#### 2. Medical

Please notify us of significant medical issues when you are considering making a booking so that we can inform you of any potential risks that may present themselves as part of the tour. Bay Tours reserves the right to decline/refuse a booking because of medical concerns.

#### 3. Health & Fitness

At Bay Tours we pride ourselves on giving personal service to our customers. However, our guides are not qualified to provide individuals, who are not of reasonable, able-bodied health, the special time and attention they may need to make their tour a memorable experience. We're very happy for you to join us if you have a caregiver that can accompany you and provide help to you along the way.

#### 4. Behaviour

Bay Tours & Charters Ltd is not a common carrier and therefore reserves the right to refuse to carry or admit a person whose behaviour is considered detrimental to the enjoyment of the group. By travelling with Bay Tours & Charters Ltd the traveller agrees to accept the authority of Bay Tours staff leading the tour and accept their decisions. Our staff are entitled to a safe working environment and our passengers to a great holiday. Any threats to safety, either physical or verbal, or inappropriate behaviour by a passenger may result in their removal from the tour. If staff require a passenger to leave a tour, no refunds will be given and the passenger will be responsible for their own travel costs from that point.

#### 5. Travel Insurance – ask us for a quote with CoverMore

In association with Cover-More Travel Insurance we offer to members insurance against unforeseen events which may necessitate you cancelling your travel with Bay Tours. This is part of a comprehensive cover policy. It will secure your refund in the event of you having to withdraw from a booking. <u>We just need your date of birth in order to</u> **provide you with a quote.** There is a \$25 excess, payable for each claimable event.

- Should you decide to make use of this insurance, it must be purchased at the time you make your booking and paid in full with your tour deposit.
- Insurance Terms and Conditions apply and will be attached to your Cover-More Travel Insurance schedule which will be forwarded to you following purchase. Please ensure you take time to read through the policy wording and make yourself familiar with the cover it offers.
- Activation of your Policy by way of claim is between you as the policy holder and Cover-More NZ Ltd.

#### 6. Cancellations and Refunds

#### With Travel Insurance

Should you be forced to cancel your travel with us due to a claimable unforeseen event, Bay Tours will calculate the level of direct refund we are able to make to you. You then simply complete a Cover-More claim form for the difference between the Bay Tours refund and the amount you paid for the tour. Once approved, Cover-More will reimburse you less the \$25 excess.

#### Without Travel Insurance

Cancellation fees without Travel Insurance with us are as follows;

#### Multi-Day Tours

#### 45 Days or more prior to commencement of the tour:

Full refund, less any non-recoverable payments to suppliers of the tour eg flights, show tickets etc

#### 44 to 22 Days prior to the commencement of the tour:

100% loss of deposit paid.

#### 21 Days or less prior to the commencement of a tour:

100% loss of tour price paid.

If you cancel at any time, and following discussion with Kaye or Kerren, you are able to get someone to take your place, you will receive a refund of the amount paid, less an admin fee of \$250 and any non-transferable payments to suppliers e.g flights

We strongly encourage the purchase of Travel Insurance in order to provide peace of mind that the full amount paid is protected (as per item 5 above).

4 Days or more prior to the Day Trip: Refund in full
3 Days or less prior to the Day Trip: No refund

There are many parallels between the European settlement of Canterbury and that of Hawke's Bay with significant numbers of settlers starting to arrive into both areas in the 1850s. And whilst Hawke's Bay's early settlement was, like much of the North Island at this time, a rather haphazard affair, the settlement of Canterbury was a much more planned enterprise. Fortunes were made



and, as a consequence, grand houses were built and gardens created. On this tour we will visit a number of these properties, most of which are now much reduced in acreage, with some still in the hands of the same settler families and others benefiting from the enthusiastic care of new owners. Our visits over this **9 Day** tour will span from the Hurunui district in the very north of the province, to Geraldine at the southern end of the great plains. Most of these properties will be <u>first-time visits</u> for **Bay Tours** and we're very excited to be given access to them. Here's a summary of the itinerary;

**Day 1:** We depart Hawke's Bay and head to Wellington where we overnight at our favourite **Copthorne Oriental Bay Hotel** before our Interislander ferry to Picton the following morning.

**Day 2:** After our morning ferry we head south on SH1 to **Kaikoura** where we overnight in the new, sparkly **Sudima Hotel** with dinner at the newly refurbished Pier Hotel.

**Day 3:** Today we take the Inland Road through Mt Lyford to the town of **Waiau** and our first historic property – **Lyndon**. Begun in 1880, Lyndon homestead was the centre of a 70,000 acre sheep run. In 2018 Jude Flintoft and Steve Smith purchased the derelict homestead and set about restoring the house, and in doing so honouring the original craftmanship achieving detailed work using hand tools only. Today Jude will host us for a cuppa and show us around the homestead and the progress made on the gardens to date. We then head to another property just down the road in **Rotherham** where Doreen and Mike Dryden have created one of the great gardens of North Canterbury at **Loch Leven**.



Doreen will put on lunch for us and show us around this stunning garden. In the afternoon we continue south into the **Hororata** area to one of the oldest homesteads still remaining in Canterbury – **Terrace Station**. Kate Foster, great grand-daughter of the station founder John Hall, will meet us and tell us all about the homestead and gardens which she and her late husband have put into a charitable trust. Tonight we stay in **Methven**.

**Day 4:** The story of the Hall family continues this morning as we visit another homestead built by the family in 1912 as part of the huge

Terrace Station – **Gunyah**. We'll have morning tea here whilst the owners tell us about its own history before showing us around. From here we head south into the foothills around Mt Somers where our first stop is **Rangiatea**, a hill country farm where Sara & Blair Gallagher have a stunning garden and Sara has created a range of jewellery featuring Agate quartz mined on the property. Sara will show us around the property and we'll be able to look through her gallery. Just down the road we visit another Sara, this time it's Sara Grigg at **Surrey Hills Station**. The Grigg family have a huge farming history in Mid-Canterbury and Sara will tell us all about it as we wander the beautiful woodland garden. For the next 3 nights we stay in **Ashburton**.

**Day 5:** Today is special as we get to visit with Rose & John Acland at **Mount Peel Station** up the Rangitata River. Not only is there the 1865 homestead and beautiful gardens, but the exquisite family stone church is another must see. Rose is originally a Nelson from Hawke's Bay and John's grandmother was an Ormond from Wallingford. So, lots to talk about here. After lunch we travel south across the Orari River to **Orari Gorge Station**. Wintering 25,000 head of stock, the station has been in the same family for 170 years and is currently home to the 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> generations. Our host, Rosa Peacock's great-grandfather settled the property in 1856. Rosa will tell us all about the history and guide us around the many restored 19<sup>th</sup> century farm buildings, the homestead and gardens.

**Day 6:** This morning we'll head to **Geraldine** for a little free time to wander the excellent **Farmer's Market** in the churchyard, maybe check out the wonderful rose garden in the Domain or just settle down with a cuppa in a café. In the late morning we turn towards the coastal plains and **Akaunui**, a homestead and farm that was originally part of the massive Longbeach Estate owned by the Grigg family, but has long been in the family of our hosts today, Di and Ian MacKenzie. They



will host us for a classic farm lunch created largely from produce on the property before showing us around parts of their magnificent 30 (yes, that's right) acre garden. Our last destination of the day is a property that was originally part of the enormous Ashburton Run but, since 1877 has been called **Coniston**. The 1918 homestead is surrounded by 6 acres of woodland, lake & formal gardens and our hosts, Carol and Donald Williamson, will welcome us and show us around.

**Day 7:** We begin our homeward journey today, but we couldn't leave Canterbury without a visit to the original seat of the pre-eminent Deans family, **Riccarton House**. Built in stages from 1856, the house is truly magnificent and we'll enjoy a guided tour of the house and grounds before we have lunch here. Then we're on the road in the afternoon and return to **Kaikoura** for the night.

**Day 8:** We wend our way up the Marlborough coast to the outskirts of **Blenheim** to **Welton House** where owner Wendy Palmer and her garden designer brother, Ross, have created something special. Wendy lives in the 1901 homestead with her daughter Maia and will show us around and give us lunch before we head to Picton and our afternoon ferry. We overnight in **Wellington** tonight.

**Day 9:** We make our way back to Hawke's Bay today, via **Palmerston North** where there will be time for lunch and no doubt shopping, before we head home.

This tour encompasses 12 properties and more importantly we'll meet some amazing people. Some are custodians of their familys' rich history in Canterbury, others having lovingly restored landmark properties to their former glory. And all with a strong desire to preserve a physical presence of past generations. Come and be part of this wonderful exploration of some of Canterbury's finest heritage properties.

We are very excited to have been invited to visit **Cape Sanctuary**, New Zealand's largest privately owned and funded '*mainland island*' conservation project, which is situated out at **Cape Kidnappers**. Established in 2006 by a local family, **Cape Sanctuary** initially had a focus on habitat restoration and pest control in order to create an environment where endangered species could re-inhabit the peninsula. Now, 18 years later the



Sanctuary boasts a population of over 600 **Eastern Brown Kiwi** with chick survival rates way above the national average. So much so, that now **Cape Sanctuary** can donate Kiwi birds to populate emerging conservation projects. Other endangered species to have been successfully translocated to the sanctuary include **Kaka** and **Kakariki** with both species now numbering in the hundreds. **North Island Robin** also now abound as does NZ's smallest native bird, the tiny **Rifleman** – deep in the most forested part of the sanctuary – and even **Takahe** with the first chick from a mating pair being born here in 2022. We'll spend the morning at the sanctuary and be guided in by our friends at **Gannet Safari Overland** in their 4WD bus and enjoy a morning cuppa with the volunteers as well. The theme of sustainability will continue through and after lunch. Francky Godinho, owner of **St Georges Restaurant** outside Havelock North, has been quietly working for years to build up his kitchen garden in order to present as much of his own grown produce on the plate as he can. After a delicious lunch at the restaurant, we have persuaded Francky to take us to the 'secret' location of his garden and show us around. Don't miss out, there are only 20 places available.

Entrepreneurs and business titans alike have made their homes in the region and this stunning, verdant heart of New Zealand is humming with optimism. Outside the main centre of Hamilton, other smaller towns such as **Te Awamutu, Raglan** and **Cambridge** are growing and booming. On this **5 Day tour** we'll discover and

celebrate some amazing ventures going on in the heart of the Waikato countryside and meet the people behind this new wave of growth. And we'll also enjoy some of the magnificent natural wonders this region has to offer.

**Day 1:** Heading north from Hawke's Bay, we'll call in to **Hobbiton Movie Set** to see the brand-new amazing hobbit hole 'interiors' recently created to match the glorious exterior

views throughout fictitious Bag End. Then it's on to **Cambridge** and the excellent **Hidden Lake Hotel**, our base for the next 4 nights.

Good for the soul.

**Day 3:** A very special day today. Our first visit is to dairy farmer Pete Morgan on his farm west of **Te Awamutu**. Pete and his wife Ann have farmed this beautiful rolling country for



20 years and they're renowned in dairy circles for championing new technology on their farm. Watch as Pete creates virtual fences in paddocks, moves stock around, and tracks their health and productivity, all simply by using an app on his phone. You'll be amazed. This afternoon we have the rare privilege of visiting what many consider NZ's pre-eminent thoroughbred horse stud. Home of legendary stallions '*Sir Tristram*' and '*Zabeel*',

**Cambridge Stud** has, more than any other horse stud, put the NZ bloodstock industry on the world map. We'll visit this incredible facility which includes their magnificent Heritage Centre. What a day!

**Day 4:** This morning, we visit **Takapoto Estate** which is 600 acres that run along 3kms of **Lake Karapiro**. Here the Plaw family have planted nearly a million native trees and plants providing a thriving eco-system to compliment the neighbouring Sanctuary Mountain. We'll enjoy morning tea and a tour of the magnificent gardens and grounds. After a wonderful slap-up picnic lunch beside the historic **Arapuni Suspension Bridge**, we drop in next door for a tour of the wonderful birdlife sanctuary that is **Maungatautari Mountain**.

Day 5: We begin our gradual journey homeward with a visit to Hodderville Farms which

covers nearly 2,500 acres and milk about the same number of dairy cows. We'll have morning tea with them in their beautifully restored Edwardian buildings and hear about their philosophy of a circular economy. We'll also visit their plant nursery which specializes in native plants for riparian and reforestation planting. A little further down the road we'll visit a '**forest free range farm**' which has been developed to home 320,000 hens that free



range in the forest's 90,000 trees and roost in eight giant sheds. The sheer size of the place means most of the farm is highly automated.

This tour is an opportunity to get out into the glorious green countryside and visit some truly innovative and captivating destinations, both man-made and natural. With welcoming people and wonderful vistas this tour has everything!

Colonial settlement in the Wairarapa pre-dates that of Hawke's Bay. Drawn to the potential of the immense fertile plain, the first pastoral leases in southern Wairarapa were agreed between settlers and local Māori in the early 1840's and farming became the backbone of the regions' economy. Families such as the Bidwells, Williams and Riddifords became foundational pillars of both Wairarapa and Wellington society and are still grounded in their rural roots today. Over **5 Days** we'll be hosted at a number of impressive country properties established by these early runholders, and still owned by their descendants. We'll also experience some of the best of the country life that this vibrant region enjoys. From grand houses and fine art collections to opulent lunches and a country race meeting, this tour celebrates the landscape and legacy of one of New Zealand's true rural

heartlands. It's a privilege to be invited into these remarkable places. Here are some of the many highlights;



**Day 1:** We make our way south through the morning arriving for a lunch hosted by the Williams family at their property, '*Te Parae*', east of Masterton. We'll spend the afternoon with family patriarch, Tom Williams, who will tell us about the history of the place and show us around. Later we settle into our home for the next four nights, the **Copthorne Solway Hotel**. It's a special dinner tonight in '*The Captains Dining Room*' at the beautiful **White Swan Hotel**.

**Day 2:** This morning, we visit '*Fernside*', at the centre of an estate first established in 1860. Associated in its early years with such prominent Wellington families as the Bunnys, Bartons and Pharazyns, *Fernside* was the home of the Elgar family for more

than half a century before being purchased by the U.S. Government in 1949 as the country residence for their ambassador. We'll enjoy a guided tour of this incredible property and its wonderful gardens. A truly magnificent lunch awaits us at the stunning **Wharekauhau**, one of New Zealand's finest luxury lodges. This will be a special experience as we enjoy

world-class cuisine and service coupled with breathtaking views across Palliser Bay. Tonight, another unique experience awaits. The night sky as you've never observed before, from the stunning environment of the mystical **Stonehenge Aotearoa**.

**Day 3:** Today we'll be part of what has always been an important event in the life of country communities. It's Race Day at the beautiful country course of **Tauherenikau**, near



Featherston. A stylish trackside picnic lunch, Member's Passes and the thunder of hooves will add to the carnival atmosphere of the day and who knows what luck might be had with the odd flutter on the 'Gee-gees'.

**Day 4:** This morning, we have a real treat in store. The Bidwell family have farmed the eastern shores of Lake Wairarapa for 180 years and were the first European settlers west of the Ruamāhanga River. The home block, known as '*Rototawai*' was once centre of a 10,000 acre farming operation. Anna Bidwell grew up in this grand 1929 house and is the 6<sup>th</sup> generation of Bidwells to live at the property. We'll have morning tea here and not only learn about this beautiful family heirloom, but also take a look at part of Anna's extensive art collection, displayed throughout the house. Lunch is at the ever-welcoming Lake Ferry



**Hotel** before we drive the **Cape Palliser** road through the fishing village of **Ngawi** and on to *Sea Lion Point* and *Uncle Wayne's Geyser*.

**Day 5:** Before beginning our journey homeward today, we couldn't finish our country tour of Wairarapa without a pilgrimage to '**Brancepeth**', home to the Beetham family. At its height, this was a sheep station of over 79,000 acres with 300 people on the payroll. We'll be hosted at the baronial homestead by Edward Beetham who is the 6<sup>th</sup>

generation of the family on the property. And with the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> generations involved as well, **Brancepeth** truly is steeped in our country's history. Many of the original farm

buildings have been restored and we'll tour them, together with the extensive gardens, after morning tea with Edward in the house.

It's rare in New Zealand to still have so many of the great country houses of a region still in the hands of the original families. The opportunity to visit with them and experience some other iconic events in Wairarapa's country calendar is a great thrill. Come and enjoy the verdant rolling countryside and fine country hospitality of this historic region.

The experience of driving through New Zealands' largest farm – nearly 450,000 acres spanning a good part of the upper South Island - is a kiwi rite of passage. The stunning scale and rugged beauty of Station together Molesworth with another Rainbow Station with its neighbouring giant, latticework of pristine lakes, is contrasted by the alpine tranquillity of the village of Hanmer Springs where we'll be based. Here's a summary;



Day 1: We depart Hawke's Bay Airport this morning and head for Christchurch. There we'll be met by our local guide, who will collect us from the airport, and we'll drive north to **Woodchester Station**, near the epicentre of the 2016 'Kaikoura' earthquake. Cattle share the sides of the sparkling rivers with Canada Geese and Paradise Ducks. It's difficult to prepare



yourself for the sheer vastness and beauty of the place. A day heavy with memorable moments.

**Day 3:** After a big day yesterday, time to relax with a FREE DAY in Hanmer Springs today.

**Day 4:** Today we head west up through the former **St** James Station and into the Spenser Range to Lake Tennyson. We'll drive over Island Pass, the highest in the country at 1300 metres, before descending into **Rainbow Station** itself – wintering both cattle & sheep - remarkable for its transitioning alpine landscapes and climate. New Zealand experienced its first gold rush after Gabriel Reid made his discovery near what is now the town of Lawrence in Central Otago in 1861. Two years later there were 22,000 people living in the gold fields from Arrowtown to Dunedin. Because of gold Dunedin was, by then, the largest and wealthiest city in the country. Places like St Bathans, Naseby, Middlemarch and Lawrence owe their foundations to the rush to find the shiny stuff. We'll spend **9 days** 



travelling a route that will broadly take us from the mountain peaks that surround the resort town of **Queenstown** to the university city of **Dunedin** on the coast and so many places in between. Here's a summary of the plan;

**Day 1:** We fly from Hawke's Bay to **Queenstown**, where we'll be met by our Bay Tours coach, and settle into the **Novotel Queenstown Lakeside Hotel**, our home for the next 4 nights.

**Day 2:** This morning we take the infamous Cardrona Road to **Wanaka** for a morning cruise on the lake. After lunch in Wanaka, we head to **Cromwell** for a look around before returning to **Queenstown**. Tonight, we dine at the legendary **Skyline Restaurant**.

In 1962 they gifted the land to NZ as a wildlife sanctuary. After morning tea at nearby **Lake Tūtira**, we're going to visit **Holt Forest Park** and enjoy time walking



some of the many well-maintained paths beneath the forest canopy. Next up is the **Bay View Hotel** for a pig-on-a-spit lunch. Some of the paths least travelled in the North Island are around the **East Cape**. It's a unique and special corner of New Zealand not often visited by travellers. We'll start our week-long odyssey with some time in the gateway to the east, **Rotorua** and gradually follow the coast around to **Gisborne**. Here are some highlights;

**Day 1:** After morning tea on the shores of Lake Taupō we head to Rotorua and enjoy a picnic lunch at the Band Rotunda in the Government Gardens. After lunch there are options to explore the gardens further, perhaps walk the lakefront trail to our hotel - the much-loved **Novotel Lakeside Rotorua Hotel**, our base for two nights.



**Day 2:** This morning we visit the world's youngest geothermal valley at **Waimangu** south of Rotorua. Created largely by the enormous **Mt Tarawera** volcanic eruption of 1886, this valley, which meanders down to the legendary **Lake Rotomahana**, is laden with a myriad of hot springs and vents including the giant Frying Pan Lake along it's many walking paths. A guided walk down to the lake is offered to those interested whilst a bus will

take the rest of us to the meeting point at the jetty on **Lake Rotomahana**. From here we enjoy a guided cruise of the lake under which lays the remains of the world-famous **Pink & White Terraces** together with over 200 hot water vents. We'll hear the history and tales and enjoy the experience of cruising this mystical body of water. We conclude our visit to Waimangu with lunch in their café before returning to Rotorua and a free afternoon to explore. This evening there will be an optional night time Redwoods Treetop Walk. Experience these giant trees and the forest around them lit up featuring David Trubridge lighting. Spectacular!

**Day 3:** We depart Rotorua this morning and after morning tea on the shores of **Lake Rotoiti** we head east to **Whakatāne**, firstly to take in the incredible views from the Heads, and then into town for lunch. Then we continue our trek east through **Ohope** and **Ōpōtiki** 

to our next stop at a small bay called **Torere**. Here Vanessa Hayes cares for her ancestral land and is having great success growing macadamias. We'll take a look around her operation and enjoy a cuppa before heading to our final destination of the day and our accommodation at the tiny settlement of **Te Kaha**.

**Day 4:** We continue our journey east today stopping firstly at **Raukokore** for a look at the century-old white



church. Look out here for the wandering 'wild' horses the area is renowned for. Then it's on to **Waihau Bay** and lunch at the Lodge overlooking the inlet and the pier. After lunch

and a look around we head towards **Cape Runaway** before finally arriving at our accommodation for the night at **Hick's Bay**.

**Day 5:** Our first stop this morning is the settlement of **Te Araroa**, birthplace of Sir Apirana Ngata and site of the oldest Pohutukawa tree on the NZ mainland at around 600 years old.



From here our journey turns south with a stop at historic St Mary's church at **Tikitiki** for a cuppa before we head on through Ruatoria and a stop at **Tokomaru Bay** for lunch. Later we arrive at **Tolaga Bay**. We'll take a walk out on the lengthy Tolaga Bay Wharf and then it's on down the coast to **Gisborne** and the wonderful **Emerald Hotel**.

**Day 6:** Arguably NZ's finest arboretum, **Eastwoodhill**, is our focus this morning. We'll be given a guided Jeep tour to enjoy this amazing collection of trees before we enjoy a picnic lunch here. This afternoon there is the option to experience the **Gisborne Railbike Adventure**. Here, on disused railway lines two bicycles specially welded together ride side-by-side on the rails. Those not participating can relax back at the hotel or do a little retail therapy.

**Day 7:** This morning our final Gisborne destination is the outstanding **Tairāwhiti Museum**. It holds constantly changing exhibitions and within its walls sit **Wylie's Cottage**, the oldest European building in Gisborne. Next door in Kelvin Park you'll find two more fabulous buildings to explore. The first is the restored two-storey wheelhouse of the steamer '**Star Of Canada**' that was wrecked on rocks off the coast of Gisborne in 1912. The second is the beautiful **Māori Battalion 'C' Company Memorial House**, a testament of the men of the East Coast who served in this famous army unit. We then depart south for lunch in **Wairoa** before continuing back towards Napier and home.

We've called this tour a 'Getaway' as it takes us to a part of our country rarely visited by tourists and puts us in touch with a New Zealand that hasn't changed much in 50 years. And that's worth getting away to!

Perhaps the most challenging stretch of railway engineering in New Zealand is between the northern Rangitikei and the wonder that is the **Raurimu Spiral**. The great Rangitikei



and Whanganui Rivers border the mountainous Central Plateau and present some of the most spectacular scenery in the North Island.

We invite you to join us, and our friends at Steam Incorporated, on a most memorable journey. The adventure begins straight away as we travel, by Bay Tours coach, across the 'Gentle Annie' road to meet the northbound train at the historic **Taihape Railway Station**. We'll board the magnificently restored 1930's carriages, with their open viewing

balcony, being hauled by massive 1950's American diesel locomotives. These beasts provide the perfect control best suited to the demands of this legendary section of railway. We initially climb up to **National Park**, the highest point of our journey at 825 metres (over 2700 feet) above sea level before our descent of the famous **Raurimu Spiral**. Solving the problem of a 200 metre drop with an impossible straight-line gradient of 1 in 24, the magic of the spiral's design is how it uses the natural contours of the land without the need for a single viaduct. After a short stop at **Raurimu Station** to re-position the loco's, we begin to climb back up the Spiral and roar south across the plateau with magnificent views of the three great Central mountains. Our journey continues as we gradually descend towards the Rangitikei River, crossing numerous viaducts through **Mangaweka**, **Hunterville** and **Marton** before we reach the Manawatu Plains and a

straight run into our final destination at Palmerston North. After such а breathtaking day we'll overnight here. The following morning there'll be time to either catch up with friends and central shop in Palmerston North, or wander the beautiful gardens and



riverside walks of **Victoria Esplanade** before we begin our journey home with a lunch stop at **Caroline's Garden & Café** at Aokautere.

This picturesque rail excursion reminds us of a time when these great iron horses were common features of our landscape. Don't miss this rare opportunity to see this remote part of the North Island like never before.

There are so many great ways of exploring our capital city. So often we make just fleeting visits for a show or a ferry crossing. But on this **5-Day** tour we're dedicating time to experience aspects of the city that can only be enjoyed slowly. Here's a summary of the tour;



**Day 1:** Our explorations begin before we even get to Wellington. North of the city, near coastal Paekakariki, are two remnants of earlier times for our capital. Until 1964 the principal way of getting around Wellington was by tram. We'll take a ride on a restored **Wellington Tram** to the **U.S. Marines Memorial**. Here on the sandy paddocks of the Kapiti Coast 15,000 Marines were stationed during WWII. Then it's on into town and our

base for the next four nights. The wonderful **James Cook Grand Chancellor Hotel**. Dinner tonight is at the renowned parliamentary restaurant, **Bellamy's**.

**Day 2:** Today has a coastal theme as we first orientate ourselves with the citywide views from the top of **Mt Victoria** before following the eastern coast road through seaside

Seatoun and Scorching Bay before we reach the remote Ataturk Memorial positioned on the southern coast because of its similarity to the hillsides of Gallipoli. We return towards town via Brooklyn and lunch at Zealandia Ecosanctuary where our native birdlife is thriving. This afternoon we take a guided tour of Wright's Hill Fortress, a WWII long range gun battery where two 135 ton guns could fire shells 18 miles into Cook Strait.



**Day 3:** We start the day with a leisurely wander through the excellent **Harbourside Market** next to **Te Papa Museum**. There's time to check out what's new in there too.

We enjoy a **High Tea** lunch at the glamourous **Hotel Intercontinental** before crossing town to our **Parliament Buildings** for a guided tour of the seat of governmental power. One street over is the architectural wonder that is **Old St Paul's** church where we'll have a tour too. This evening dinner is on Queens Wharf at **Shed 5**.

**Day 4:** There's an opportunity for a sleep in or to catch up with friends or family as the morning is your own. We come together for a fabulous Chinese '*Yum Cha'* lunch at hugely popular **Dragons** restaurant. Waiters constantly bring around a myriad offering of different dishes which you can accept or decline. A fun family gathering time in the capital. After lunch we head to the home of our Governor General, the palatial **Government House**, for a guided tour of this majestic place. Hope you saved a space from lunch because it's Italian at **Fratelli** in Blair St tonight.

**Day 5:** We say farewell to the city this morning. But not before we drop in to **Cars Inc.** a stunning collection of vehicles housed right next to the old General Motors assembly plant in Trentham. We'll have a cuppa here while we admire the beautiful cars on display. Then we continue our journey home with a lunch stop in **Greytown** on the way.

We're very lucky to have secured access to some of the activities on this dive below the surface of `*The Coolest little Capital City in the World*'.

**Day 6: Breaksea & Doubtful Sounds** After a quiet night aboard surrounded by the nature and wilderness of Breaksea Sound, join your naturalists on deck to spot seabirds including the majestic Wandering and Buller's Albatross as we pass Breaksea Island, which guards the entrance to Breaksea Sound. It was on Breaksea Island that the first successful island rat eradication program was completed. Today it is a protected nature reserve of great significance to the many endangered species which call the island

home. From here we sail onwards towards some of the most spectacular scenery in all of Fiordland – Doubtful Sound, or the sound of silence as it's also known. Spanning some staggering 40-kilometres and holding the title as New Zealand's deepest fiord, Doubtful Sound with its cloud-scraping wilderness cloaked mountains, sheer cliffs, waterfalls, inlets, quiet coves and wildlife presents nature on a scale so grand it's off the chart. Tonight, we enjoy a cruise farewell dinner.

This classic tour has become something of a Bay Tours institution. The stunning scale and rugged beauty of **Molesworth Station** together with another neighbouring giant, **Rainbow Station** with its latticework of pristine lakes, is contrasted by the alpine tranquillity of the village of **Hanmer Springs** where we'll be based. Another stark contrast



to the impression of permanence at **Molesworth** can be seen when we visit **Woodchester Station** where the effects of the Kaikoura earthquake will astound you. A **FREE DAY** in Hanmer Springs itself allows you time to relax or explore this beautiful alpine village between our big station touring days.

**Day 1:** We depart Hawke's Bay Airport this morning and head for **Christchurch**. There we'll be met by our local guide, Ross Carter. Ross has been guiding

visitors to this area for decades and his company, Molesworth Tours, has 40 years experience introducing people to the Molesworth and Rainbow back country and has been

leading Bay Tours trips through the area for more than a decade. Ross will collect us from the airport and we'll drive north towards **Woodchester Station**, east of Hanmer Springs and nestled in the shadow of the St James Range. Here the Kelly family will host us for lunch and show us some astonishing evidence of natures' power which has transformed their lives forever. Later in the afternoon we make our way to **Hanmer Springs** and our

superb centrally located base, the cozy **Drifter's Inn** where hosts Adele and Andy MacLeod will look after us for the next four nights.

**Day 2:** Today we're collected by Ross in a special 4WD mini-coach and we head over **Jack's Pass** and into the Clarence Valley and **Molesworth Station**. We'll visit iconic points on the massive station such at the 150yo **Acheron Accommodation House, Isolated Flat** with its hundreds of acres of rippling clover and tussock grass, and the main central homestead complex



with its century old cob buildings. Cattle share the sides of the sparkling rivers with Canada Geese and Paradise Ducks. It's difficult to prepare yourself for the sheer vastness and beauty of the place. Passing through sections of the **Muller** and **Tarndale Stations** on the way back, we descend back into **Hanmer Springs** again via the rugged **Jollies Pass**. A day heavy with memorable moments.

**Day 3:** There's time to relax and reflect on yesterday as you have a **FREE DAY** in Hanmer Springs today. Explore this beautiful alpine village with its many bush walks, wander the tranquil grounds of the old Queen Mary Hospital with its historic buildings or enjoy a soak in the pristine thermal Hot Pools of the spa which gives the town its name. Tonight, we'll dine together at the hotel.



**Day 4:** Today we're back with Ross as we again climb Jack's Pass but, this time, we head west up through the former **St James Station** and into the Spenser Range to **Lake Tennyson**. We'll drive over **Island Pass**, the highest in the country at 1300 metres, before descending into **Rainbow Station** itself. Craggy beechcovered mountains sweep down to the boulderstrewn rivers that bisect the valleys. Remarkable for its transitioning landscapes, Rainbow Station is much smaller than Molesworth in area at a 'mere' 20,500 acres.

Usually carrying around 14,000 head of stock – a mix of sheep and cattle this time - its diversity of terrain and climates has made its productivity legendary. What a contrast.

**Day 5:** We depart Hanmer Springs this morning and make our way back to **Christchurch Airport** but not before a visit to **Iron Ridge Sculpture Park** on the banks of the Waipara River. Here sculptor Raymond Herber has, over 20 years, transformed a former limestone quarry into a huge, stunning, exhibition space like no other. Then it is on to the airport where, after a late lunch, we catch our flight back to 'the Bay'.

**Molesworth** and **Rainbow Stations** make up a land truly alive with the evocative atmosphere of stockmen and shepherds, dogs and drovers, slough hats and well-worn saddles. it is to get a glimpse of their way of life and to meet some of the people continuing the legacy.

It's been a few years since the warming balmy breezes of "The Winterless North" have beckoned us. With time to spend in the jewel that is the **Bay of Islands** plus a wonderful sojourn even further north to beautiful **Doubtless Bay** and now the addition of time in the stunning **Hokianga**, this edition of our **North of the North** tour will be the most comprehensive and satisfying yet. In all, this **10 Day** round trip will allow us

to better experience this most historically important of regions. And the weather's usually pretty good in Spring too! Here's a summary of this amazing itinerary;

**Day 1: Hawke's Bay to Auckland** We set out on our summer adventure heading north as far as Auckland today and staying at the fabulous **Waipuna Hotel**.

We disembark at **Russell** on the way back and enjoy a guided tour of our country's first capital before returning on the ferry to **Paihia** to relax or explore. Dinner tonight is at the stunning **Zane Grey's** restaurant at the water's edge.

**Day 4: Paihia** A **FREE DAY** of leisure today. Perhaps wander the **Paihia Arts & Crafts Market** on the Village Green or explore further along Marsden Rd to the beautiful stone church of **St Pauls.** Maybe grab some delicious fish & chips from Vinnies for lunch and enjoy them on the waterfront or visit the **Paihia Library**. If you enjoy a swim there are three excellent beaches within 10 minutes walk of the hotel or maybe just relax poolside. Tonight, we come together to enjoy a wonderful Chinese meal with our friends at the secret hideaway **King Wah** restaurant.

**Day 5: Waimate & Waitangi** This morning we visit the first mission station established by Samuel Marsden at **Waimate** in 1832 and enjoy morning tea in the gardens. Later we stop for a picnic lunch by the delightful **Haruru Falls** before making our way to the magnificent **Waitangi Treaty Grounds**. Here a guide will show us around Hobson's Landing and up to the Treaty Grounds themselves where there will be plenty of time to look through **James Busby's Treaty House** and the new museum dedicated to the **28<sup>th</sup> Māori Battalion**. The views across the bay to Russell, Paihia and Opua from the



giant Treaty Ground lawn are fabulous. Tonight, we take the ferry to Russell for dinner at **The Duke Of Marlborough Hotel**. Superb!

**Day 6: Paihia to Doubtless Bay** We say farewell to Paihia this morning as we head north, firstly to **Kerikeri** to visit the historic **Stone Store** and New Zealand's oldest building, **Kemp House**. There's so much to see around this complex. We then continue further north to **Doubtless Bay** and our first stop in the district is lunch at the legendary **Mangonui Fish Shop** which sits out over the water. There's time after lunch to explore this picture-perfect seaside settlement before we head a little further around the bay past **Coopers Beach** and **Cable Bay** to visit **Gumdiggers Park**, dedicated to the legacy of the thousands who, more than a hundred years ago, came to the Far North to dig for the precious **Kauri Gum**. Set amidst a real former gumfield, the Park gives a fabulous insight into the lives of the gum diggers and the value of the Kauri Gum (or Amber) they extracted. After this we settle into our new home at the lovely **Taipa Beach Resort**. With its palm trees, beachfront location and warm sea breezes, it's easy to imagine you're in the Islands.



**Day 7: Cape Reinga & Ninety Mile Beach** We spend today taking a custom-built 4WD coach to the very northern tip of New Zealand, **Cape Reinga**. What a thrill to speed along the sands of **Ninety Mile Beach** and power through the streams and gullies around the giant sand dunes south of the Cape. We return to **Taipa** for the night.

Day 8: Doubtless Bay to the Hokianga This morning we pack up and head south. And after a beach morning tea at **Kaeo** we meander towards the

Since the incredible experience of our first group venture into Fiordland aboard the vessel *Heritage Explorer* in 2022, we have been wanting to experience the **Marlborough Sounds** with them. Anyone who has been on one of our weeks in the deep south on *Heritage Explorer* will tell you how memorable it is.

In early **December 2025** we will be exploring the **Marlborough Sounds** in-depth. Famed for the breath-taking beauty of its winding cobalt waterways, iconic landscapes, lush native

forests, wildlife and remote coastlines, the region is also rich in early New Zealand history and the location of some of the country's most important conservation efforts. The opportunity to reach parts like d'Urville Island, French Pass, Tawhitinui Reach and both **Pelorus** and **Kenepuru Sounds** is rare, and our 7 Day expedition aboard Heritage Explorer with her expert crew will allow us the time to really get beneath the surface of these fascinating



spots. Here's a summary of what you can look forward to;

**Day 1:** Our adventure begins when we meet our fellow voyagers at Hawke's Bay Airport. We fly to **Blenheim** where we'll transfer to our hotel, the wonderful **Chateau Marlborough**, for the night in readiness for tomorrow.

**Day 2:** After a hearty breakfast our journey begins in earnest as we're collected from the hotel and we transfer by road to **Havelock** at the head of **Pelorus Sound**. Here the Captain and Expedition Team will be waiting to welcome you aboard **Heritage Explorer** and show you to your cabin. You'll have the opportunity to familiarise yourself onboard before joining your fellow travellers and your Expedition Team as we set sail along Pelorus Sound this afternoon and into **Kenepuru Sound** where we'll anchor for the night.

**Days 3 & 4:** After exploring **Kenepuru Sound** this morning, including our first use of the Zodiac tender craft, we'll return to **Pelorus Sound** and into **Nydia Bay** and the more active amongst us can enjoy walking part of the **Nydia Track**. There's lots of bays to explore as we make our way towards **Tawhitinui Reach** and one of the many picturesque anchorage spots for the night. The morning sees us continuing northward along **Pelorus Sound**, the largest in Marlborough. With 380kms of remote coastline, Pelorus sits in silent splendour and ready for careful exploration. Nature envelopes us at **Ngawhakawhiti Bay** where it's possible to get a feel for what the Sounds would



have been like before the native forest was cleared. Tonight, we drop anchor before we reach open water at the mouth of the sound.

**Day 5:** Today we sail through notorious **French Pass**, which features the fastest moving tidal flows in New Zealand, in the wake of French explorer Dumont d'Urville and then explore the island named in his honour. The outermost island in the Marlborough Sounds, **d'Urville** features imposing sea cliffs along its west coast, a high mountainous backbone and some of the country's finest peninsula scenery. **Dolphins** and **Fur Seals** are common in the waters surrounding the island and it's from here that *Pelorus Jack*, the endearing Risso's Dolphin who famously stole the nation's heart, guided ships across the dangerous waters of the Cook Strait between 1888 and 1912.

**Days 6 & 7:** First sighted by Abel Tasman in 1642, it was Captain James Cook aboard *Endeavour*, who would first

set foot in **Queen Charlotte Sound** and make **Ship's Cove** his base during his five visits between 1770 and 1777. We'll spend two days exploring the waterways and islands of this spectacular sound with opportunities to head ashore and walk a section of the **Queen Charlotte Walkway** as well as visiting the birdlife on predator-free islands. A visit to **Tory Channel** brings the history of the Perano Whalers to life. We'll also spend time in **Ship's Cove** itself and learn its history, exploring the Cove and

visiting the remote **Captain Cook Memorial** inaugurated in 1913. Blumine Island another is conservation success story with rare birds like the Orange-fronted South Parakeet and Island Saddleback both now thriving on the island after being translocated. On our final night together, we'll enjoy a farewell dinner and look back on the highlights of the last week.



Day 8: We arrive into the inner

reaches or **Queen Charlotte Sound** and after a final breakfast and farewells we disembark at **Picton** & transfer to Blenheim Airport for our flights home to **Hawke's Bay**.

**Heritage Explorer** will be our floating home for the 7 days we explore. It's a 30-metre, 4-deck New Zealand flagged vessel built in 2004 and features a contemporary wood-



finished interior, 10 well-appointed ensuite cabins across three decks, a dining room boasting spectacular 180-degree panoramas and theatre capabilities; lounae and bar featuring a flight of inclusive regional New Zealand wines, beers and spirits; and a well-stocked local library. Outside, guests can enjoy plenty of covered space on the Bridge Deck or relax on the Sun Deck perfect for wildlife spotting, sunrises and sunsets, or simply enjoying watching your Heritage Explorer voyage unfold. Kayaks and fishing

equipment are available for use during the voyage, while two tender craft allow for deeper exploration and the unforgettable wildlife encounters synonymous with all Heritage Expeditions adventures. **Heritage Explorer** has an open bridge policy and a full commercial kitchen helmed by a talented chef focused on highlighting local produce and any guest catches of the day, as well as an enthusiastic and passionate expedition team, and will be staffed by a New Zealand captain and crew.

The expedition vessel features state-of-the-art technology to provide a comfortable cruising experience with high performance dual Scania 653 engines, bow thrusters, fin stabilisers, full air-conditioning, sound attenuated twin generators and a hydraulic aft ramp, while a comprehensive navigation package ensures the ultimate Kiwi adventure awaits all guests.

The **Marlborough Sounds** is an area many New Zealanders have travelled through on their way to somewhere else. But few have the opportunity to spend time exploring this magnificent, diverse, historic maritime marvel. Come and enjoy the tranquility of Marlborough's glittering waterways, under the warmth of December sun, and be part of an extraordinary adventure which will change the way you view this unique part of New Zealand.
