1. Reservations & Payments

All day trips should be made in one payment at the time of booking.

For all overnight or longer tours, a deposit as stated in the Leisure Guide is payable to secure the booking. The balance must be paid in full by the declared date in the Leisure Guide.

Any customer who has booked a package with Bay Tours shall not assign, purport to assign, or attempt to re-sell the package (whether whole or in part), rights or interests under these Terms without prior consent from Bay Tours.

Any reservation made within six (6) weeks of the tour departure must be paid in full.

2. Medical

Please notify us of significant medical issues when you are considering making a booking so that we can inform you of any potential risks that may present themselves as part of the tour. Bay Tours reserves the right to decline/refuse a booking because of medical concerns.

3. Health & Fitness

At Bay Tours we pride ourselves on giving personal service to our customers. However, our guides are not qualified to provide individuals, who are not of reasonable, able-bodied health, the special time and attention they may need to make their tour a memorable experience. We're very happy for you to join us if you have a caregiver that can accompany you and provide help to you along the way.

4. Behaviour

Bay Tours & Charters Ltd is not a common carrier and therefore reserves the right to refuse to carry or admit a person whose behaviour is considered detrimental to the enjoyment of the group. By travelling with Bay Tours & Charters Ltd the traveller agrees to accept the authority of Bay Tours staff leading the tour and accept their decisions. Our staff are entitled to a safe working environment and our passengers to a great holiday. Any threats to safety, either physical or verbal, or inappropriate behaviour by a passenger may result in their removal from the tour. If staff require a passenger to leave a tour, no refunds will be given and the passenger will be responsible for their own travel costs from that point.

5. Travel Insurance – ask us for a quote with CoverMore

In association with Cover-More Travel Insurance we offer to members insurance against unforeseen events which may necessitate you cancelling your travel with Bay Tours. This is part of a comprehensive cover policy. It will secure your refund in the event of you

having to withdraw from a booking. We just need your date of birth in order to provide you with a quote. There is a \$25 excess, payable for each claimable event.

- Should you decide to make use of this insurance, it must be purchased at the time you make your booking and paid in full with your tour deposit.
- Insurance Terms and Conditions apply and will be attached to your Cover-More Travel Insurance schedule which will be forwarded to you following purchase. Please ensure you take time to read through the policy wording and make yourself familiar with the cover it offers.
- Activation of your Policy by way of claim is between you as the policy holder and Cover-More NZ Ltd.



Whenever you see this symbol beside a tour, please note that travel insurance is a mandatory requirement for participation.

6. Cancellations and Refunds

With Travel Insurance

Should you be forced to cancel your travel with us due to a claimable unforeseen event, Bay Tours will calculate the level of direct refund we are able to make to you. You then simply complete a Cover-More claim form for the difference between the Bay Tours refund and the amount you paid for the tour. Once approved, Cover-More will reimburse you less the \$25 excess.

Without Travel Insurance

Cancellation fees without Travel Insurance with us are as follows;

Multi-Day Tours

45 Days or more prior to commencement of the tour:

Full refund, less \$150 admin fee plus any non-recoverable payments to suppliers of the tour eg flights, show tickets etc

44 to 22 Days prior to the commencement of the tour:

100% loss of deposit paid.

21 Days or less prior to the commencement of a tour:

100% loss of tour price paid.

If you cancel at any time, and following discussion with Kaye or Kerren, you are able to get someone to take your place, you will receive a refund of the amount paid, less an admin fee of \$250 and any non-transferable payments to suppliers e.g flights

We strongly encourage the purchase of Travel Insurance in order to provide peace of mind that the full amount paid is protected (as per item 5 above).

Physical Activity Level Indicators

To ensure each Bay Tours trip and tour is enjoyable for the whole group, certain minimum standards of fitness and mobility MAY be required. Before booking any tour, potential participants must be confident that their own general level of both health and fitness is sufficient to enable them to complete the tour. For example, a multi-day tour will likely require a greater degree of stamina than a day trip. As Tour Leaders, our primary concern must always be for the enjoyment and welfare of the tour group as a whole. Any ongoing need for assistance by an individual can detract from the quality of the group experience.

So, we have re-purposed our system of indicating what, if any, minimum standards of fitness and mobility may be required, to more accurately reflect the requirements of each tour.

Instead of the previous **Red Man** symbol we have devised a series of three **Physical Activity Level** indicators which will be applied to each trip or tour that requires it. Where no **Physical Activity Level** appears in a tour description, this indicates there is no minimum level of fitness or mobility required to participate. However, each person must still be confident that their general health is at a level that will ensure their safe participation.

The 3 **Physical Activity Level** indicators are:

GENTLE | ABLE | ACTIVE

Where any of these indicators appear within a tour description, please refer to the following criteria;

GENTLE

- Get on/off coaches, boats & trains unaided
- Be able to participate in small walks, at a gentle pace, for 10 15 minutes on mostly level ground
- Climb the occasional flight of stairs
- Be able to stand for **up to 15 minutes**

ABLE

- Get on/off transportation unaided (possibly including small planes, helicopters etc.)
- Be able to participate in walks, at a relaxed pace, for up to 30 minutes
- Climb a flight of stairs or incline
- Be able to stand for up to 30 minutes
- Walk confidently over uneven ground or undulating surfaces

ACTIVE

- Get on/off transportation unaided
- Be able to participate in walks, at a relaxed pace, for **up to 60 minutes** without having to rest
- Climb a flight of stairs or incline
- Be able to stand for up to 30 minutes at a time
- Walk confidently over uneven ground or undulating surfaces

Physical Activity Level ACTIVE

Step back in time and into nature as we venture deep into the heart of Whanganui National Park for a truly unforgettable experience – A visit to the legendary **Bridge to Nowhere**.

Soldiers returning from WWI were balloted land in the isolated **Mangapurua Valley**. But with no road access the hard life and meagre income that the rugged land offered up was near impossible to endure. Through the 1920s many of the families up the valley simply walked off their land. And by the time the government got around to completing the promised permanent bridge across the stream in 1936, finally giving road access, there were few



families left farming there. When funds for the maintenance of the road to the bridge were declined in 1942 the remaining families packed up and left. In the decades since, the bush has reclaimed the farmland and the road in as well. Only the bridge itself, now seemingly sitting in pristine wilderness, remains as a reminder of human occupation. Here's a summary of our trip into this 'other-worldly' place;

Day 1: Our adventure begins with a leisurely drive to **Ohakune**, taking in morning tea at **Kuripapango**, a delicious lunch stop at **Flat Hills**, and a pause at the poignant **Tangiwai Memorial** before settling into the elegant **Powderhorn Chateau**.

Day 2: Today we journey by jet boat up the Whanganui River, with its steep banks of native bush, to the start of an easy 50-minute guided walk to the mysterious bridge that stands as a monument to dreams abandoned and communities lost to time. After a picnic lunch beside the bridge, when we'll hear stories from our local expert whose family were involved in its construction, we return via river to Pipiriki and drive the River Road to visit the beautiful historic church of St Joseph's at the isolated riverside settlement of Jerusalem before returning to our accommodation in Ohakune.

Day 3: On our final day, we collect a sweet treat from the iconic **Johnny Nation's Bakery in Ohakune**, to enjoy with our **picnic lunch beside Lake Taupō**, and journey home, full of stories and memories.

Physical Activity Level ABLE

From pristine Fiordland on the southern west coast to unique Stewart Island and eastward to The Catlins, we'll explore the deep south led by our own son of the South.

Bay Tours owner Ken Withington is Southland born and bred and with wife Kerren, will lead this **11-day** pilgrimage back to his roots and show off the scenic grandeur and southern hospitality of **The South of the South**.



Day 1: We fly to beautiful **Queenstown** this morning where Ken will meet us with the Bay Tours coach and then it's a wonderful scenic drive to **Te Anau** where we settle into our hotel.

Day 2: Our exploration of **Fiordland** begins today with a trip into **Doubtful Sound** via **Lake Manapouri** and the **Wilmot Pass**. Three times longer than Milford Sound and ten times the surface area, a cruise of remote **Doubtful Sound** will reward with abundant wildlife and incredible vistas and birdsong.

Day 3: An amazing morning awaits as we cross **Lake Te Anau** and experience a guided tour of the hugely popular **Te Anau Glowworm Caves** by path and small boat. On our return to Te Anau you have a Free Afternoon with perhaps a visit to the **Te Anau Bird Sanctuary** for those interested.

Day 4: Today we take the world-renowned road, including the **Homer Tunnel**, to iconic **Milford Sound** for an astounding scenic cruise around one of this country's greatest natural wonders. Then we're back to **Te Anau** for the night.

Of all the destinations we go to with Tour Club members, perhaps the region most shrouded in mystery is the South Island's **West Coast**. The region remains a steadfastly remote part of New Zealand. To even begin to get a feel for the place it takes a few days to get around what is the country's largest region. From the highest mountains and stunning coastal scenery to dense rainforests and everything in between. Steeped in myth and legend

from ancient Māori pounamu (greenstone) trails and Moa hunts to pioneering settlers and tough miner tales, 'the Coast' is a world apart. Where every passing car waves to you and the hospitality is warm and 'old school'.

From Westport in the north to Haast in the south, we'll meander through this fascinating region where the natural environment still dominates every residents' life in some way. Here's a summary of the itinerary;

Day 1: We fly to **Wellington** and then on to **Nelson**, where our coach will meet us and we begin our adventure. After lunch in **Murchison**, and a look at the famous **Buller Swing Bridge**, we carry on to the historic mining town of **Reefton** which is experiencing a renewal in recent times. We'll have billy tea with the **Bearded Miners** and sample the local moonshine before we settle into our accommodation at **Dawson's Hotel**.

Day 2: We make our way this morning to Westport to meet our guide for the day, Mickey,

who will take us for a tour of the **Stockton Coal Mine**, New Zealand's largest single coal producer. We'll drive through several small towns on our way up onto the Stockton Plateau where we'll first have lunch in the 'Smoko Room' before we get a real sense of the workings of this open-cast mining operation, as well as visiting the aerial ropeway which takes the coal down to the railhead at Nakawau. As we start our journey



south we'll stop at Punakaiki to see the world-famous **Pancake Rocks** before arriving at the **Scenic Hotel Punakaiki**, our accommodation tonight.

Day 3: We stick with the mining theme this morning, as we continue our journey south, stopping firstly to look around the **Brunner Mine Historic Area** – site of New Zealand's worst mining disaster in 1896. Then it's on to the town of **Blackball** with its famous (not)Hilton Hotel and Blackball Salami Co. Down the road we can still see the remains of the old mine entrance and chimneys. A gentle walk along **Greymouth**'s riverside reveals more memories of the regions mining past before we enjoy lunch at the **Theatre Royal Hotel** in Kumara. This afternoon we wander the spectacular **Hokitika Gorge**, with its turquoise water, before we check into the lovely **Beachfront Hotel** in Hokitika.



Day 4: Our southerly direction continues today and our first stop is a short boat cruise across the beautiful Lake Mahinapua south of Hokitika, followed by lunch at the famous West Coast Treetop Walkway, a steel causeway that allows you to walk amongst the canopies of ancient temperate rainforest giants such as Rimu and Tamahi. And all 20 metres above the forest floor. Then we continue south through Ross and Hari Hari to Franz Josef where we'll

take a short helicopter flight up to the **Franz Josef Glacier** and step onto this amazing force of nature. What a way to finish an enriching day experiencing the West Coast environment.

Day 5: After a night at **Franz Josef,** we continue south to picturesque **Lake Matheson**, the most photographed lake in New Zealand. And with unparalleled views, across the mirror-like surface of the lake itself, of Fox Glacier, Mt Tasman and Aoraki/Mt Cook, you can see why. After a cuppa we head into the UNESCO World Heritage Area that is **Haast**. At this point we leave the main highway, stay with the coast road and arrive at magnificent **Jackson Bay**, on the edge of **Mt Aspiring National Park**, for a glorious waterfront lunch at **The Cray Pot**. After lunch and a look around, we return to the highway and head through the **Haast Pass** towards Lakes Wanaka and Hawea. Tonight, we stay on the shores of **Lake Dunstan**.

Day 6: Today we first head up the eastern side of Lake Dunstan to **Tarras** at the foot of the **Lindis Pass** for a cuppa before crossing Hawea Flat to high country **Glen Dene Station**. Bound by **Lake Hawea** in the east and **Lake Wanaka** in the west, **Glen Dene** is 15,000 acres with extensive panoramas back towards the Southern Alps. Following the popularity of our initial tour visiting farming enterprises around the Gisborne district in early 2022, we're very pleased to introduce an updated encore adventure. Since the 1880s the hill country around Gisborne has been home to some of the most successful and innovative rural enterprises in the country. All manner of both agriculture and horticulture have thrived in this part of the East Coast at one time or another.

Hawke's Bay farming dynasties have had numerous familial connections to the Gisborne area, so we're delighted to pay a few of these places a return visit AND introduce some farming operations we're visiting for the first time. Over **4 days** we'll visit a variety of rural enterprises who are, like so many farms today, recognizing changing customer needs and diversifying their offerings. Here's a summary of the planned itinerary;

Day 1: After driving north and stopping for morning tea at **Gemmell's** shiny new café in Wairoa, our first farm visit takes us up onto the plateau at the southern end of the Mahia Peninsula. **Onenui Station** occupies just over 8,200 acres on the triangular southern tip of the peninsula and farms both cattle and sheep. Since the 1950's, when the farm was only accessible every 12 hours with the tide, Onenui Station has been owned and managed by **Tawapata South**, an incorporated iwi entity that also owns the land operated by Rocket Lab at the very tip of the peninsula. We'll learn about this award-winning farming operation and also enjoy lunch here. After our visit we carry on to **Gisborne** and the

Day 2: This morning we visit Waipura Station which ranges over 2,100 acres on the steep hills just out of Gisborne. After morning tea and a chat in the woolshed with the Foster family we'll head out in time to catch the shepherds in action with their dogs. A glorious lunch is in store at the beautiful Bushmere Arms before we head to our final destination of the day, Turihaua Angus Stud, the oldest Angus stud farm in Australasia. Established by J.N. Williams (of Frimley orchard fame) in 1897, Tarihaua remains in the Williams family to this day. The family will show us around their operation and talk about the

extensive history of Turihaua and the Williams name.

fabulous **Portside Hotel**, our home for the next 3 nights.



Day 3: Today begins in the Rere District west of Gisborne and another internationally acclaimed Angus stud, **Tangihau Station**. Since its establishment over 70 years ago, the station has had only 3 managers and is owned by East Coast farming royalty, the Bayly family. This is our first visit to the property, and we'll have morning tea with the current Station Manager, Dean McHardy, who has run the property for more than 30 years, and learn why the sale prices of **Tangihau Angus** bulls are often the highest in Australasia. We'll also be shown around their recently completed complex for their own on-farm bull auctions. No trip into this area would be complete without a visit to the splendid **Rere Falls**. We have lunch at **Eastwoodhill Arboretum** and enjoy a tour of this national



woodland treasure by jeep in the afternoon.

Day 4: Today is Saturday and that means our first stop of the day MUST be the **Gisborne Farmer's Market**. Then we're off for another first-time visit. **Pihitia Station** is a 2,500 acre coastal hill country sheep breeding & finishing station that has also been in the same Williams family as Turihaua

since 1896. Toby Williams is the 5th generation to run the property. Toby is also Chair of Federated Farmers Meat & Wool Council and a passionate advocate for NZ wool. He'll show us around and tell us about coastal hill farming. We'll enjoy lunch on Gisborne's beautiful **Waikanae Beach** before we begin our homeward journey back to the Bay.

It's always a privilege to gain access to, and be shown around, private farming concerns and to listen to the people responsible for growing and maintaining them. Prepare to hear some remarkable stories of international success amid all the familiar farming challenges. Places are limited so book early for this remarkable tour.



The Rangitikei and Whanganui districts were settled by the first European settlers earlier than Hawke's Bay but in many ways the regions share a similar history of development. Having led a number of tours across these districts, we've sought to include what we believe have been the best experiences of historic homesteads, gardens and activities we could capture in a **4 Day** tour. Following the turn of the 20th century the **Whanganui** and



Rangitikei districts were well placed to benefit from the pre-World War I economic boom. More than 100 years on, many grand houses are still set in mature grounds and gardens and, in some cases, are still occupied by the original families, hidden away in the countryside.

Day 1: We set out heading south and, after morning tea, arrive in the settlement of Bulls. We're going to be hosted for lunch at the **Bulls Friendship Club Hall**. You'll be

astonished at the history of this little town. After lunch we visit **Overton**, a homestead near Marton dating from the 1880s. We then head on to **Whanganui**, our base for the next couple of nights.

Day 2: We first make a visit across the river to the unique **Durie Hill Elevator** which has, since 1919, been carrying passengers up through the hill to the suburb and war memorial above. Then we cross town to the **Bason Botanic Gardens** for morning tea before carrying on west to **Bushy Park** homestead, designed by Charles Natusch, for lunch and a guided tour. From here we head back to town for a guided tour of the stunning, nationally renowned, **Sarjeant Gallery**, recently re-opened after being closed for a decade for major renovations.

Day 3: Our morning begins with a visit to **Paloma**, a remarkable garden near Fordell out of Whanganui. We'll enjoy a guided tour of the garden and a cuppa with the owners. Our next destination north of Marton is, in our view, one of the great country houses of this or any other district. **Merchiston** is one of the few grand Edwardian homes, anywhere in the

country, that has been continuously occupied by the family that built it. In fact, the building is in the same fine condition it was when the last workman left in November 1908. We'll enjoy a picnic lunch in the garden here followed by a guided tour of the house by the family. We carry on to Palmerston North where we overnight.

Day 4: Our day begins with a visit to another Charles Natusch designed homestead, **Wharerata**, these days



surrounded by Massey University. The home was built for Arthur Russell, formally of Mangakuri Station in Hawke's Bay. We'll enjoy a talk and tour of the property as well as a cuppa here. Our next stop, before we make our way home, is at the astonishing Italian Renaissance-style garden of **Villa Candotti** in the heart of Manawatu. Since moving to the property in 2003 Peter and Jeanette Cranstoun have designed, planted, styled and utterly transformed what was a 2 acre sheep paddock into a magnificent formal garden complete with a Florentine villa. We'll enjoy a guided tour of the garden with Peter as well as lunch here too. From here we re-commence our drive back to the Bay and home.

All the properties we visit during this tour highlight the commitment and passion that past and present generations have shown to the land and its heritage. We feel lucky and privileged to be able to visit all of these remarkable places.

The section of **State Highway 3** which follows the west coast of the North Island from **New Plymouth** up to **Hamilton** is rarely explored by those of us here in the east. Initially clinging to the coast and following the North Taranaki Bight before turning inland at Mokau to avoid Mt Messenger and heading into King Country. Following the Waipa River through Otorohanga to Te Awamutu and the prosperous rolling dairy country of the Waikato, it

makes its way into Hamilton itself where it morphs into SH23 out to Raglan back on the west coast. So, we're going to spend a number of days wandering this area with plenty of reminders of classic New Zealand.

Day 1: We head west with lunch in **Whanganui** and a stop at the southern terminus of SH3 at **Hawera** then on to **New Plymouth** and the lovely **Devon Hotel**, our base for the next couple of nights.

Day 2: Begins with an opportunity to explore the city at leisure with destinations such as **Puke Ariki Museum**, the amazing **Len Lye Gallery** or the **City Shopping Centre** mall. First a brief stop at the astonishing Te Rewa Rewa (whalebone) Bridge and then morning tea at The Three Sisters & Elephant Rock and also a stop at the amazing Mangapohue Natural Bridge before arriving for a late lunch at The Huhu Cafe in Waitomo. After lunch we continue on SH3 through to Te Awamutu. We spend the night in 'Rose Town'.

Day 4: Today sees us initially head further inland to stunning **Sanctuary Mountain** at Mangatautari for a guided tour around this bird, animal and plant reserve before we can resist the call of the coast no longer and turn west to the historic settlement of **Kawhia** and the beautiful inlet it overlooks. We'll enjoy a picnic lunch and a jaunt to **Kawhia's Hot Water Beach** for a paddle and brief soak. From here it's up through Pirongia Forest Park and Ngahinapouri to **Hamilton** and our hotel, the wonderful **Novotel Tainui** right on the Waikato River.

Day 5: A day trip to **Raglan** is the focus today. A cruise on the tranquil **Raglan Harbour** is followed by a fish & chips lunch at **The Wharf Kitchen** and time in the afternoon to wander around this remarkable little town before we head back to Hamilton. What a day!

Day 6: We visit perhaps the best kept world-class secret in New Zealand - **Hamilton Gardens**. This remarkable public space is home to numerous 'Themed' gardens featuring stylised forms of gardens from around the world. At over 2,500 kilometres, the **Murray River** is one of the longest in the world. The river basin covers one third of the Australian continent across the states of Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria before the river itself reaches the Indian Ocean through South Australia.

One of the great Australian experiences is a trip up 'The Murray' on a riverboat and we're taking a cruise along part of this water highway aboard the Southern Hemisphere's largest inland paddle wheeler – the **MV Murray Princess**. Over the **5**-

Perhaps there are no two places in New Zealand that evoke the romantic notion of man alone with the elements than the **MacKenzie Country**, situated pretty much in the centre of the South Island, and that huge inland region to the south, over the Kakanui Range, known simply as **The Maniototo**. Innumerable tales abound of hardships and tragedies over the generations since the pioneers first settled in

these areas. From the moment you enter the vast Mackenzie Basin from the north a distinct change in the landscape greets you. The often blue skies highlight a backdrop of snow cloaked mountains that seem to rise from nowhere. The golden tussock grasslands that carpet the district appear, in the sunlight, to sit on the hill sides like velvet and the turquoise glacial lakes glisten and beckon. Over the mountains and southward, the plains of The Maniototo form part of the Central Otago area that comes closer than any in NZ to a continental climate. This means low rainfall, sparce vegetation and the coldest winters and warmest summers in the country. And the red tussock that prompted Māori to give the area the name than means 'plans of blood' replaces the golden colours of further north. Though Māori had lived in both these districts intermittently over the centuries, they were virtually empty of human habitation when, in the 1850's, both James MacKenzie (whose name is lent to the district) and J.T. Thompson, further south - Scotsmen both - became the first Europeans to venture so far inland from the east coast. In MacKenzie's case it was to hide the sheep he'd stolen with the assistance of his trusted sheep dog, Friday. For Thompson, it was to survey that area and the unique place names in the district such as Eweburn, Wedderburn and Kyeburn reflect his Scottish farming heritage. Bay Tours invite you to join us for a **7 Day tour**, in Spring, exploring these most fascinating of southern districts. Here's a snapshot of the planned itinerary;

Day 1: We take late morning flights to, first Wellington then on to Christchurch before

heading to **Rangiatea Station** in the Canterbury foothills where owners, Sara and Blair Gallagher, will show us around their beautiful property. Tonight, we stay in **Ashburton**.

Day 2: Today we head into the **MacKenzie Basin**, but not without a stop first at one of NZ's finest artisan food producers, **Barkers of Geraldine**. We'll enjoy morning tea at this superb maker of preserves before we carry on



for lunch at **Fairlie** and then over **Burke's Pass** as the first vistas of the MacKenzie country come into view. At **Lake Tekapo** we'll check out the famous Church of The Good

Shepherd that overlooks the lake and enjoy a leisurely soak at **Tekapo Springs**, with views across the lake, before checking in to our accommodation **Pepper's Bluewater Resort**.

Day 3: No visit to the MacKenzie Basin is complete without experiencing the views across the district from atop **Mt John**. It's recognised as one of the finest places in the world for observing the night sky. Nonetheless the daytime 360 degree views across the lakes, tussock land and mountains will take your breath away. From here we head south towards the turquoise waters of Lake Pukaki and to **Braemar Station**, a Perendale sheep farm on the lake's eastern shore, for lunch with owners Hamish and Julia MacKenzie. After lunch we follow the shoreline around Lake Pukaki and up into **Aoraki/Mt Cook National Park** and the legendary hotel, **The Hermitage**, our home for the next 2 nights.



Day 4: Today is a very special day! For today we will join Mt Cook Ski Planes for an amazing scenic flight across the Southern Alps culminating with a landing on the Tasman Glacier. This is an experience of our most acclaimed alpine region like no other. Flights will be staggered through the day, so the rest of your time is FREE to explore the extensive Hermitage complex. Perhaps check

out the **Sir Edmund Hillary Museum** or the **Planetarium**, walk the **Hooker Track** or simply enjoy the alpine views from one of the many vantage points inside the hotel itself. **Day 5:** We say farewell to The Hermitage this morning and make our way back into the MacKenzie Basin to continue southward. We'll visit the famous '**Clay Cliffs**' of **Omarama** and walk through these 'other worldly' pinnacles and ridges that tower over us. Then, after lunch, we make our way down the **Waitaki River Valley** via the impressive **Benmore** and **Aviemore** dams. After a brief stop in iconic **Kurow**, we head through **Duntroon** and over the mountainous **Dansey's Pass**, an old stock route between the MacKenzie/Wataki districts and The Maniototo. We'll have dinner at the beautifully restored **Dansey's Pass Hotel** before descending into the town of **Ranfurly** where we'll stay tonight.

Day 6: Today we explore The Maniototo, firstly heading out through **Weddeburn** and **Otuehura** through the **Ida Valley** stopping at historic **Hayes Engineering**, a beautifully restored complex of buildings where, for decades, the Hayes family literally made anything that any of the locals needed. From here it's on through settlements like **Omakau** and **Lauder** to the old gold mining town of **St Bathans** where we'll have lunch in the supposedly haunted **Vulcan Hotel**. After a chance to wander this fascinating village overlooking the curious Blue Lake it's on to **Naseby** to try our hand at the most Maniototo of winter sports - curling. Our last night together is back in **Ranfurly**.

Day 7: Our last day begins with a scenic drive through the southern Maniototo and Taieri districts. Places with such evocative names as **Kyeburn** & **Hyde**, following the **Rock** &

Pillar Range, through **Middlemarch** and on towards Mosgiel and our destination – **Dunedin Airport**. From here we fly home, via Wellington, to **Hawke's Bay**. These magical regions have captivated locals and visitors alike with their big skies, rolling tussock and pristine lakes, for generations. Countless artists and writers have been inspired by their stark grandeur and yet so much of them remain largely unchanged today. Join us as we explore and celebrate these most iconic of New Zealand environments, the way only Kiwis can.

Japan is an island country full of fascinating contrasts. From ultra-sleek modern cities to traditional villages, historic shrines and soaring alps, the seemingly contradictory reverence for an ancient culture nestled within an ultra-modern technological society is one of this county's great enigmas. And its reputation for being a very clean and safe country is yet another attraction for visitors. With four distinct seasons, Japanese landscapes offer

much to the visitor at any time of the year. And whilst travelers flock to the country in April and May to enjoy the cherry blossoms, it is in autumn that **Japan** undergoes its most stunning transformation. The hot, humid summer gives way to crisp days, and the trees respond with a spectacular show of colour. **Japan** in autumn is an experience like no other: ancient temples blanketed in red maple leaves, golden Ginko trees lining wide boulevards, and misty mountains covered in a rich tapestry of orange and rust. For many travelers, it's the most beautiful season to explore the country. Fewer crowds, at this time of the year, also make autumn one of the most comfortable and scenic times to visit.

In **November 2026** we'll immerse ourselves in Japan's autumn magnificence. The **24 Day tour** can be separated into three distinct sections. greater. Traditional markets, Sumo wrestling and even a day trip to the alpine spa town of **Hakone**, with its stunning views of Mt Fuji, are all on the agenda for these days.



Days 5 – 18 Cruise exploration of Japan: Our exciting cruise journey aboard the gleaming Diamond Princess cruise ship begins in Yokohama. Princess Cruises have embraced Japan as a destination like no other cruise line has. Opportunities to experience elements of Japanese culture, onboard ship, are seemingly endless. Amongst the packed daily

activity schedule there are basic Japanese lessons (and English lessons for Japanese passengers), origami classes, Japanese festival dance classes, the chance to dress in a *yukata* (a summer-style kimono) with help from Japanese volunteers, traditional Japanese story tellers and many other cultural activities to explore. Many of the classes offer an opportunity to interact with Japanese passengers who come along to both learn and help. The cruise itinerary is essentially an anti-clockwise circuit of the three islands noted above with **11 different ports** visited over the 14 days of the cruise. From the colour-laden orchards and forests of Honshu's north, down Japan's western coast with its old provincial cities and small fishing ports, to the verdant hillside cities of volcanic Kyushu and the great feudal castles of Shikoku where history abounds with legends of samurai and shogun. Or how about enjoying the best views of Mt Fuji right on your stateroom balcony as you sail into Shimizu? There's simply no better way to experience so much of **Japan**, in our limited time, than from the comfort of your floating resort, the **Diamond Princess**.

Days 19 - 24 Kyoto, Nara, Hiroshima & Osaka: Arriving back in Yokohama, we farewell Diamond Princess and have our first experience of the Shinkansen (Bullet

Train) as we zoom our way to **Kyoto** at a speed of up to 285km/h (177 mph). Over the next couple of days we'll explore historic **Kyoto** and the ancient Japanese city of **Nara** with our English-speaking guide. The **Kinkaku-ji (Golden Pavillion)** in **Kyoto** shimmers over a mirror-smooth pond and the parks and Great Buddha at **Todai-ji** in **Nara**, with their resident deer, will astound you with their grandeur. Back in **Kyoto** you'll wonder at how the magnificent **Kiyomizu-dera** shrine can stay



balanced on its wooden terrace and marvel at the glorious **Yasaka Pagoda** among the stone lanes of **Sannenzaka**. And for a countryside contrast, the calm and tranquility of one of Japan's most sacred sites – the shrine of **Fushimi Inari** with its 'tunnel' of identical red *torii* (gates) – will relieve the senses. The following morning we're back on the **Shinkansen** and speeding to **Hiroshima** for a poignant and inspiring guided tour of this city raised from the ashes. Our final destination is Japan's culinary capital and second largest city, **Osaka**. We'll take in the views from **Umeda Sky Building** and explore the vast complex of imperial **Osaka Castle**. The neon lights of the **Dotonbori and Namba districts** are a wonder to behold and any stay in this city wouldn't be complete without a lunch of the local delicacy – **Okonomiyaki** (Osaka's beloved savoury pancake). On the last day we fly back to **Tokyo** and depart for home from Narita Airport.

Back in early 2025 Kerren and Ken spent time exploring Japan, with the assistance of some local contacts they'd made through the travel industry. Their aim was to identify the best way our Tour Club group could experience this amazing country, and the result is this **24 Day** adventure with the destinations reached by land and sea complementing each
